A Pillar of Texas' Local Economies

The aggregates and concrete industry is a pillar of local economies across Texas, supporting good-paying jobs while keeping dollars circulating in communities and strengthening the local tax base.

- ✓ Each **job** in the aggregates industry **supports** nearly **6** jobs in the local economy⁴
- ✓ Each **dollar** of wages earned creates another **\$4.95** of earnings in other sectors in the local economy⁴
- ✓ Based on industry data, jobs in this industry range from **\$50,000 - \$90,000** with **advancement** leading to **six-figure earnings**⁵
- ✓ Since materials must be sourced within 50 miles, jobs can **Not Be Outsourced**¹
- ✓ These are **Middle-Class Careers** that don't require a four-year degree, alongside high-paying, skilled opportunities in engineering, geology, and other STEM fields⁵

Keeping Costs Low for Families and Communities



Transportation can influence up to 70% of aggregates and concrete costs. **Locating plants close to the communities** they serve keeps homes, schools, and infrastructure **more affordable** while **reducing traffic** and helping **projects stay on time** and on budget.⁶

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
